Pontesbury Parish Council are pleased to announce that at the January parish council meeting Councillors considered the budget for 2025-26. We are pleased to announce a 2.59% decrease in the 2025-26 without precept for corresponding cutting back on services offered.

This budget also includes the refurbishment of the public toilets and installation of solar panels on the Pavilion roof.

Pontesbury Parish Council - Happy New Year to everyone from the parish council.

**2025-26 precept for Pontesbury** - At the January parish council meeting Councillors considered the budget for 2025-26. We are pleased to announce a 2.59% decrease in the precept for 2025-26 without any corresponding cutting back on services offered. This has been achieved mainly by prudent investment of reserves and a good rate of interest received.

**Highways Concerns** - Councillors raised several concerns about the state of highways in the parish, reported by councillors and local residents, and have requested a site visit with Shropshire Council Officers. Cllr Hodges has written a piece about the particular issues being experienced in the Cruckton area. [see page 9]

Concerned about potential traffic offences? - A local resident attended the meeting to raise the concerns about the behaviour of some drivers using the mini-roundabout as you enter Pontesbury from Minsterley. The resident has been in touch with Cllr Fletcher (Chair, Parish Council), Cllr Nick Hignett (Shropshire Councillor for the area) and the local policing team. Cllr Hignett and the parish council hope to have a site visit with Shropshire Council Highways Officers soon. In the meantime, the local policing team have explained that there is a West Mercia operation called Operation Snap. As part of Operation Snap, members of the public can report and submit digital footage showing potential traffic offences via a secure online form. council website www.pontesburyparishcouncil.org.uk) This can range from driving dangerously or carelessly, to overtaking on solid white lines, using a mobile phone while driving, ignoring traffic lights or dangerous driving around other road users, such as horse riders and cyclists.

Pontesbury Library - It was agreed to increase the contribution made by the parish council (in conjunction with Friends Of Pontesbury Library) towards the running costs of Pontesbury Library. Shropshire Library Service are very pleased that in Pontesbury the library visit and book loan figures have both risen compared to the same period last year. The parish council is very proud of the successful partnership between FOPL, the library service and the parish council (who fund and manage the Pavilion building), to provide this much used and loved community facility.

**Planned Capital Projects** - 2025 will be a busy year for the parish council who hope to carry out refurbishment works to the public toilets and will be installing solar panels at The Pavilion. We apologise for the ongoing closure of the public toilets. The remedial works following the vandalism are proving more complicated than originally thought, partly due to the ageing doors. We hope to have them open in the next few weeks and then refurbished completely by the end of the year.

**Local Elections in 2025** - 2025 will also bring local elections at parish and county level. If you are interested in becoming a parish councillor please come and find out more at one of our council open days, planned for Spring 2025. These will be advertised in the newsletter in.

The next Parish Council meetings will be held on Monday 9th February 6.30pm at The Pavilion and the Annual Parish Meeting on Monday 9th March at Pontesbury Public Hall.

#### Pontesbury and Rea Valley Community Good Neighbours Review of 2024

2024 has been another very busy year for the Pontesbury and Rea Valley Community Good Neighbours organisation, with fifteen dedicated volunteers and five committee members working extremely hard on a wide variety of activities to support the community.

The monthly Coffee Mornings at the Plough in Pontesbury are very well supported and continue to be a success, with the smaller groups at the "Coffee and Chat" meetings and the Gentlemen's Club providing support to those who prefer to meet in an environment where this a smaller group of like-minded individuals. Often those who attend the smaller groups then have the confidence and the desire to attend the larger Coffee Mornings and the Luncheons, which is great to see.

The Luncheon at the Public Hall in Pontesbury has had another successful year, with around forty people attending, and the events will continue to be organised until March 2025. The Committee would like to thank the volunteers who work tirelessly either cooking, serving, helping behind the scenes, setting up the hall, clearing up afterwards – the Luncheons would not be possible without the time given by these people.

The Good Neighbours group supported the Carers' Event this year with the provision of a donation for a buffet lunch and some musical entertainment, which was well received by those who attended. Good Neighbours still has three volunteers befriending vulnerable individuals in their homes. Other events and activities in 2024 included the provision of Easter Eggs for Severn Hospice, donations of biscuits to the Rea Valley Food Bank at Christmas for hampers, provision of emergency food parcels for families under special circumstances, and additional support for vulnerable families with further food bags being created and provided. Pontesbury C of E Primary School were supported by us providing bags of compost for a garden project. Pontesbury Sports Association have also been supported by the Good Neighbours group this year with the purchase of new flooring and equipment. This year's Christmas Meal was held at The Gates at Ford, where 56 guests and nine volunteers enjoyed a three-course meal. The Good Neighbours committee organised the post-lunch musical entertainment and provided transport to and from the event. The feedback from those who attended was tremendous, with some describing it as "the best one yet".

The "Festive Friends" activity, supported by the Good Neighbours group, once again ensured several individuals who would otherwise have been alone at Christmas were able to share a festive meal with others on Christmas day.

The Committee would like to wish everyone a Happy New Year, and 2025 promises to be just as busy as previous years. With regular meetings, luncheons, coffee mornings and smaller groups continuing to provide the support to the Community that is so desperately needed.

The Committee would like to record its thanks to the Pontesbury Co-Op, Pontesbury Parish Council, Hignett's, Pontesbury One Stop, The Plough at Pontesbury, and to all members of the community who have made donations to the Good Neighbours group, and to those from the community who help out in so many ways. The ongoing activities of the Pontesbury and Rea Valley Good Neighbours would not be possible without the support from all these individuals, groups and companies.

#### **Shropshire Council Matters** - **Shropshire Councillor report from Nick Hignett.**

Shropshire Council continues to relocate from Shirehall to the Guildhall in Frankwell, with all meetings expected to be on the new site from February.

The Government has announced the draft financial settlement for the next year. Council Officers are working through the details to produce a medium-term financial strategy before a decision is made on the Council Tax for 2025/2026.

Shropshire Archives will be reducing public opening to one day a week (Thursdays) temporarily while staff work to inventory and relocate 55,000 boxes of corporate records, currently held at Shirehall.

The 2nd planning application for Smithfield regeneration project has been submitted, regarding plots between Smithfield Road and Raven Meadows.- Application number 24/04476/EIA is on the Council's planning register, with a decision due to be made in March.

#### **CRUCKTON WARD NEWS** reported by Clir Allan Hodges

- 1. The Parish Council is aware of the problems caused to Cruckton residents by the worsening road flooding near Cruckton School [Fitzroy Academy]. Whilst it does not have the power to take direct action this is the responsibility of Shropshire Council it has repeated its previous requests for swift remedial action. Also, it has explored the possibility of a public meeting with the responsible flooding officer of Shropshire Council.
- 2. The requests by Cruckton residents, as revealed in last year's survey, for speed restrictions and reduction in HGV passing through the village were forwarded to Shropshire Council. The response was that as a result of budget restrictions and legal obligations Cruckton's concerns would be given future consideration but could not be given high priority compared with similar requests elsewhere in the County where there are a high number of accident injuries. It may be possible to get some action via the CIL money generated by recent developments in the Parish.
- 3. The six low cost starter homes next to the former Hare and Hounds pub have attracted considerable interest. They are for sale at approximately 20% below market price. Local people were given first option and then people outside the Parish were given the opportunity to purchase the remaining properties. In the future, behind these six affordable homes, there will be four fairly large houses at near open market value in order to make the development viable.

**Pontesbury & District Gardeners' Association** The Trading Post re-opens on Saturday 1st February and the bulk delivery of multi-purpose compost, both reduced-peat and peat-free, has arrived and a special offer on three bags or more of the peat-reduced compost is in place.

There is a good stock of seed potatoes as well as pea, bean and beetroot seeds and onion and shallot sets. Details of which varieties we will have are not available yet, but we do know of one variety that we won't have: Pink Fir Apple potatoes have grown in popularity over the last few years but are not available this year.

As well as our opening date of 1 February here are more dates for your diary:

**11 March**: Annual General Meeting, held at 7.30 pm in the Len Simpson Room of the Public Hall, where refreshment will be provided after the main business of the evening has been concluded.

**26 June:** Spring into the Garden, held in Pontesbury Public Hall, starting at 7.30 pm. This has been moved from our usual May date to tie in with the Pontesbury Festival (more details of this appear elsewhere).

23 August: Garden and Craft Show, held in the Public Hall, and open for viewing at 2.30 pm. Entry free.

It's a great way to start to get a little more active. The sessions take place in a fun, sociable and supportive environment. Walking tennis uses lighter racquets, softer slower balls and slightly adapted rules, including allowing two bounces. These rule changes mean that walking tennis is immediately accessible to all - even if you have never tried tennis before.

Weekly sessions at Longden Tennis Club will start on 10th January 2025 with everyone welcome to come and try it out. You do not need any special clothing - just come along as all equipment will be provided.

<u>Pontesford Hill Public Consultation summary</u> Forty people braved a freezing night in November to join the Friends of Pontesford Hill for a public consultation on the future management of the hill. It was an exciting and informative evening: thank you very much to all of you who attended and to those who contributed by email.

In general, people expressed confidence & strongly supported action to improve the existing habitats and to increase diversity; supporting two new fence lines: one to protect animals on the scree slope from dog attacks, and one to enclose the summit of Pontesford Hill, allowing grazing there to re-establish the acid grassland, and potentially increase the area of the SSRI at some point in the future.

People were broadly happy with our gradual "coppice coup" process of felling plantation conifers and encroaching sycamore along the bulldozer track to replant with mixed deciduous woodland trees, in particular hazel to encourage dormice, which also favours woodland flowers and birds by opening up the woodland canopy. Supporting also a new coup area behind "the dens" where children play, to try to restore the lost bird life there. They emphasised that they wanted a gradual process over years, with no clear felling.

During the discussions, we were issued with some new challenges: It was pointed out that our bird boxes, originally used to encourage spotted flycatchers, are now only encouraging great tits and blue tits, which will outcompete the endangered willow tits. This is important as there are historical records of willow tits on the west side of the hill, and a bird which may have been a willow tit was visiting a bird feeder on Grove Lane last year. Our coppice coups on the bulldozer track are ideal habitat, and we have been asked to enhance them by manufacturing nest sites out of decaying silver birch trunks. At the same time, we will remove the old birdboxes to reduce the competition from more robust tits.

The "upper ant hill meadow" habitat is declining due to lack of sheep grazing, and is in danger of losing its SSSI status. The issue here, as everywhere else, is the conflict between sheep grazing and dog walking. It was suggested that we ask The Dogs Trust for advice on the way forward, and we had many offers of help with management of stock and signage. People were very proud of the volunteer goat warden scheme we used last year, and we have offers of future help.

The final message was that public affection for the Hill remains as strong as ever, and people want more information about what is going on. We will try to address that communication gap via the village newsletter, posters and social media.

#### Introduction;

As well as caring for Poles Coppice Country-side Heritage Site, Shropshire Council Parks and Countryside Team also look after the former Nils Quarry, which features areas of species-rich grassland rich in orchids,



a pond, woodland and views of rock faces

#### Works undertaken this year


Visitor facilities The entrance signage at both car parks for Poles Coppice were very faded so new panels were purchased which details the history, wildlife and walk routes that are open to visitors. Another job that is planned is the repair of the picnic table at Poles Coppice to replace rotten legs and make it more accessible to wheelchairs Grassland management The meadow at Nils Quarry was cut and collected in October to create a healthy sward for wildflowers to prosper. This was using new kit that has been sourced by the Parks and Countryside Team

Access for All Grant Success The team have successfully applied for a grant to upgrade the paths at Nils Quarry, because they are so level, they make an excellent option for people with mobility problems. 175m of path will be upgraded (cleaned back and re-surfaced) and 180m of new path will be created to make a circular route for people to use. Thanks to the Shropshire Hills Protected Landscape for their generous funding for this project. Works are planned for early 2025

Wildlife Surveys In order to better manage the habitats of both sites, we undertake regular monitoring of wildlife and are very lucky to work with a dedicated bunch of volunteer recorders known as the Joy of Wildlife Group. Within the group are experts in many different types of invertebrate and plant. The group regularly visit Poles Coppice and will be visiting Nils Quarry in February 2025 Young Rangers The Young Rangers scheme continues to yield huge benefits for local young people. Recently the team have installed a new bench at Nils Quarry and a welcome board will be coming soon

**Financial position;** Budgets at Shropshire Council remain very tight and with little light on the horizon for non-statutory services like Parks and Countryside. With that in mind, Pontesbury Parish Council have agreed a grant of £2500 for financial year beginning April 2025




